Tobacco Products Marketing (Control) (Amendment) Ordinance 1990
Ordinance no. 16, 1990

Ordinance promulgated with a view to amending the Tobacco products marketing (Control) Act 1990.

WHEREAS it is expedient and necessary to amend the Tobacco Products Marketing (Control) Act 1988 (Act no. 45 of 1988) with the view of attaining the objectives mentioned below

AND WHEREAS Parliament is not in session and the President is satisfied that the necessary condition exists for taking immediate measures

THEREFORE the President declares and promulgates the following ordinance under the powers vested in paragraph 93(1) of the constitution.

1) Brief heading- This ordinance shall be known as the Tobacco Products Marketing (Control) (Amendment) ordinance 1990.

2) Amendment of clause 3 of the Act 45, 1988- The Tobacco Products Marketing (Control) Act of 1988 (Act 45 of 1988) will henceforth be known as the above Act and its sub-clause (2) of clause 3 is rescinded.

3) Addition of new clause to Act 45 of 1988- A new clause, 3a will be added to the said law after clause 3 as below:

"3a. Ban on advertisements of Tobacco products- Publication, publicity and display of tobacco products advertisements in Radio, Television, Newspapers or any other media or in any other form will not be permitted".

4) Amendment of clause 4 of Act 45 of 1988- The words and figures "clause 3" of clause 4a of the said Act will be replaced by "clause 3 or 3a".

ANNEX B.

EXTRACT FROM THE CONSTITUTION
OF THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF
BANGLADESH.

39. (1) Freedom of thought and conscience is guaranteed. Freedom of thought and conscience, and of speech.

(2) Subject to any reasonable restrictions imposed by law in the interests of the security of the State, friendly relations with foreign states, public order, decency or morality, or in relation to contempt of court, defamation or incitement to an offence—

- (a) the right of every citizen to freedom of speech and expression; and
 - (b) freedom of the press,
- are guaranteed.

40. Subject to any restrictions imposed by law, every citizen possessing such qualifications, if any, as may be prescribed by law in relation to his profession, occupation, trade or business shall have the right to enter upon any lawful profession or occupation, and to conduct any lawful trade or business. Freedom of profession or occupation.

41. (1) Subject to law, public order and morality— Freedom of religion.

- (a) every citizen has the right to profess, practise or propagate any religion;
- (b) every religious community or denomination has the right to establish, maintain and manage its religious institutions.

(2) No person attending any educational institution shall be required to receive religious instruction, or to take part in or to attend any religious ceremony or worship, if that instruction, ceremony or worship relates to a religion other than his own.

42. (1) Subject to any restrictions imposed by law, every citizen shall have the right to acquire, hold, transfer or otherwise dispose of property, and no property shall be compulsorily acquired, nationalised or requisitioned save by authority of law. Rights to property.

“(2) A law made under clause (1) shall provide for the acquisition, nationalisation or requisition with compensation and shall either fix the amount of compensation or specify the principles on which, and the manner in which, the compensation is to be assessed and paid; but no such law shall be called in

5) Amendment of clause 5 of Act 45 of 1988- The words and figures "Clause 3" of clause 4a of the said Act will be replaced by "clause 3 or 3a).
