Brief Introduction Tobacco Industry Interference

- For decades, the tobacco industry has actively worked to undermine public health tobacco control efforts
- From passing laws and regulations to implementation and enforcement, industry interference happens at all points of tobacco control efforts
- Interference can be obvious, and it can be masked by the efforts of a third party, front group, or secretly funded individual
- Identifying, exposing and countering interference is vital to successfully moving forward tobacco control efforts and protecting populations from the harms of tobacco

Tactics

Building alliances and front groups i.e. "third party technique"

Weaken the public health community

Disputing and suppressing public health information

Producing and disseminating misleading research and information

Directly lobbying and influencing policy-making

Influencing "upstream" policies,

Litigating or threatening litigation

Facilitating and causing confusion i.e. smuggling

Seeking to manage and enhance its own reputation in order to increase its ability to influence policy




Priorities areas of Union and STOP Monitoring

- Corporate transformation: TI activity related to general attempts to presenting tobacco companies as being good actors and shifting away from traditional tobacco products. Examples: BAT's Bonayon, Supernova initiatives etc.
- Tax, illicit trade, and smuggling: TI activity to undermine tax or track and trace policy, invoke illicit trade arguments and data, or facilitate smuggling. Examples: lobbying for favorable tax rates, lots of media news of smuggling, and funding illicit trade research.
- MPOWE(R) policy interference: TI activity to block, weaken, or delay core TC policy progress (beyond tax).
- COVID-19: Any TI activity related to the COVID-19 pandemic (e.g. CSR, policy interference, marketing, and misuse/funding of research).
- Alternative products (e-cigs, HTPs, ENDS, etc.): TI activity related to
 introducing or promoting non-traditional tobacco and nicotine products to
 a market. Examples: suspected ally activity like Vapors of Bangladesh,
 online TAPS on e-cigs etc.
- Foundation for a Smoke-Free World: Country and regional PR, research and programmatic activity of the Foundation, its staff, known allies, and grantees.

Industry Tactics

- Advertising/Promotion/Sponsorship (TAPS): marketing, promotion, brand stretching, social media/online advertising, sponsorship, point of sale
- Corporate Social Responsibility: donations, events and initiatives, announcement of awards
- Direct Policy Interference: lobbying, political contributions, drafting legislation, voluntary agreements, avoiding or violating current polices
- Corporate Activity: change in corporate form, merger or acquisition, PR campaign, corporate branding
- Allies and Front Groups: emergence of a new ally or front group, PR or advocacy campaign
- Litigation: legal action taken, threat of legal action
- Science and Research: create and distribute deceptive research, fund research or surveying, misleading use of research



Examples:
